


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
## Make a model of a tooth

4. Stick dentine (C) to pulp (C).
5. Stick enamel (D) to dentine (D).

**Incisor**


**Canine**



# Teeth 2.3a

## Dangerous Decay




### Question cards

A game for 2-6 players. You will need a tooth counter per person and a set of questions. The aim of the game is to answer questions correctly and prevent your tooth meeting 'Dangerous Decay'.

### Instructions

1. Place cards on the board.
2. Place tooth counters on the start, and decide who is going first.
3. Player 1 is asked a question from the top card on the pile. This should be asked by the player on his or her left. If the question is answered correctly, the tooth counter should be moved 1 space towards the star. If it is answered incorrectly then it should be moved 1 space towards Dangerous Decay.
4. Player 2 is now asked a question by the player on his or her left and moves his or her counter as outlined above.



5. Play continues like this until a player reaches the star. This player is the winner.
6. If a player reaches Dangerous Decay, he or she must stay there until they answer a question correctly, allowing them to move 1 space towards the star.

## Teeth 2.3b

### Dangerous Decay (cards)

**What is the function of incisors?**

Answer: For biting and cutting food

**What is the function of canines?**

Answer: For tearing food

**What is the function of molars?**

Answer: For chewing and grinding food

**What is enamel?**

Answer: The hard outer part of the tooth

**Where would you find the root of a tooth?**

Answer: Under the gum

**What happens when teeth decay?**

Answer: We get toothache

**What do you call the part of the tooth which you can see when you smile?**

Answer: The crown

**What is tooth decay?**

Answer: When the tooth rots

**Where would you find nerves in the tooth?**

Answer: In the pulp

**What kinds of food help to cause tooth decay?**

Answer: Food which has lots of sugar such as sweets and fizzy drinks

## Teeth 2.3c

### Dangerous Decay (cards)

**Who helps look after our teeth?**

Answer: A dentist

**How often should we brush our teeth?**

Answer: At least twice a day

**What can we do to look after our teeth?**

Answer: Brush them, eat non-sugary foods and go to the dentist

**What causes plaque?**

Answer: Food and bacteria

**How often should we change our toothbrush?**

Answer: Every 3 months

**What kind of toothpaste should we use?**

Answer: Fluoride toothpaste

**How many teeth is a baby born with?**

Answer: None

**What is another name for baby teeth?**

Answer: Milk teeth

**What does a dentist do when our teeth decay?**

Answer: Gives us a filling

**How many teeth does an adult have?**

Answer: 32
